

Encouraging, Educating, Equipping, and Empowering Camp and Retreat Leadership

My friends and colleagues throughout the LOM community –

It's a Holy Week like none that we've ever experienced before. As we reflect on the abruptness of Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem to his betrayal and death on the cross, I pray that just as Jesus' resurrection changed the world forever, so too will the new life that springs from the ministries you suspect will not be the same will be full of new life and community that's difficult to envision today.

I give thanks for the quality of leadership that I see you providing for our outdoor ministry organizations. From our LOM ZOOM Forum last week, I reflect on the insight shared by Mary Kay Duchene on what those who rely on our leadership need from us as leaders –

- Trust the organization
- Feel compassion
- Experience stability
- Know that there is hope

Thank you for being the leaders your organizations need right now. Thank you for being the leaders our church need. Thank you for being the leaders our world needs.

Another chestnut of wisdom that Mary Kay gifted to us, as we acknowledge the fear that we all have about an uncertain future, "if we don't do anything different from the normal, the changes that are sweeping over us might leave us with nothing at all".

Our camps/retreat centers are certainly figuring out how to be proactive in dealing with the next several months for which there is so little we can be assured of forecasting with accuracy. My observation around the network is that all of our organizations are committed to doing something in acknowledgement that things will be different, rather than nothing at all. I'm finding that many of the outdoor ministry organizations of LOM are gradually moving toward one or the other of two models for navigating the next several months.

That's why on Tuesday, April 14, 12 EDT, 11 CDT, 10 MDT, 9 PDT, we are going to have a ZOOM Forum where Dave Jarvis, executive director of Rainbow Trail (CO), is going to make a presentation about the thought process that went into he and the Board arriving at the course of action they have decided to take and the strategies and contingencies that they will be having in place.
